LM: I Tell me how you first got involved with La Mesa?

During the school months, I got up early enough to feed and milk the dairy cows, get ready for school, eat breakfast, and get on a school bus at 7:30am. Getting back from school, I did the evening chores, ate dinner, did my homework, and went to bed to get ready for the next day.

LM: What keeps you coming back every week?

Roger: I continue to come back to La Mesa as I want to do my part to help the community feed the body while other volunteers are there to feed the soul. I eagerly look forward to preparing dinner each month and serving on other days as needed.

Whatever Happened to Scotty?

If you go to our website, <https://www.lamesaministries.org/blank-2> you can read and see where we left off on Scotty. Everyone was so proud and happy for what he finally achieved. He was free from his bondage to drugs and alcohol after graduating from the 15-month Teen Challenge faith-based recovery program. Scotty was so happy to return to society and his new life. He was blessed with a furnished apartment and ready to start over.

Then the perfect storm occurred. Within days of moving into his apartment, he was infected with the COVID-19 virus, had to be quarantined and was unable to start working. His father passed away and he was not able to attend his father's funeral. He was depressed and angry, and that is when Satan moved in. He was emotionally weak and vulnerable and that is when an old friend found out where he was living and stopped by to say hello. Hello, started the downward spiral and Scotty had returned to his life of dependency on drugs with his friend leading the way. He lost the apartment, became homeless again and ended up in jail for 3 months.

How many times have we all failed? How many times do we fall short and repeat the same sins repeatedly? How many times does Jesus say we are to forgive our brothers and sisters? In Matthew 18:22 Jesus gives us the answer. *"I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times."*

While sitting in his jail cell, Scotty prayed for forgiveness and to find a way back to his Savior. He knew Jesus was alive and present at La Mesa so he reached out to the Resource Center for help. We opened our arms in friendship and let him know that God never gives up on us and He promises to never leave us. The Resource Center assisted Scotty in returning to Teen Challenge for their 6-month restoration program. During his restoration time he prayed for a renewed relationship with his son and daughter. The Lord has answered his prayer. Scotty has decided to stay at Teen Challenge as an intern after he graduates in November. His desire is to become a staff member where he can share what he has learned with others who are experiencing a dependency on drugs and alcohol.
